

ORDINANCE

#19-21

AN ORDINANCE BY THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF DUBLIN TO ESTABLISH A RESTAURANT DISTRICT IN CERTAIN AREAS OF DOWNTOWN DUBLIN; TO SET AN EFFECTIVE DATE; AND FOR OTHER LAWFUL PURPOSES.

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council are vested with the authority and general police powers to regulate the consumption, sale, and distribution of alcohol within the city;

NOW, THEREFORE, THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF DUBLIN HEREBY ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION ONE:

There is added a new subsection 4-29.1, titled "Restaurant District" to Article I, general provision, of Chapter 4, Alcoholic Beverages, which shall read as follows:

"Section 4-29.1 - Restaurant District.

- (a) There is hereby established a "restaurant district" within the city wherein open containers of alcoholic beverages shall be permitted as provided herein.
- (b) The restaurant district shall consist of the area described below and as illustrated on the "restaurant district map" below:
 - 1) All sidewalks along the side of the buildings and public parking lots that front North and South Jefferson Street on the western side of the street from the intersection of North Jefferson and West Gaines Street on the north to the intersection of South Jefferson and the first set of Seaboard Coastline's railroad tracks on the south;
 - 2) All sidewalks along the side of the buildings and public parking lots that front South Church Street on the eastern side of the street from the northernmost corner on the east of Bellevue Avenue and South Church Street on the north to the first set of Seaboard and Coastline's railroad tracks on the south;
 - 3) All sidewalks that front Bellevue Avenue and West Jackson Street on the north side of the street from North Church Street to Jefferson Street;
 - 4) All sidewalks that front Roosevelt Street on either side of the road from W. Gaines Street on the north to the first set of Seaboard Coastline's railroad tracks on the south;
 - 5) The sidewalk that fronts West Gaines Street on the south side of the street only from Roosevelt Street on the west to North Jefferson Street on the east;
 - 6) The sidewalks that front Monroe Street on either side of the street from Bellevue Avenue on the north to the first set of Seaboard and Coastline's railroad tracks on the south;
 - 7) All associated pedestrian cross walks, and any other public spaces, including the Jackson Street Plaza and Bicentennial Plaza, other than lanes of travel for traffic
