

**RESOLUTION  
#24-02**

**A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF DUBLIN, GEORGIA BY AND THROUGH ITS MAYOR AND COUNCIL AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO NEGOTIATE A CONTRACT FOR THE EMERGENCY REPAIR AND UPGRADE OF SEWER MAINS AT CHURCH STREET AND RICE AVENUE; TO AUTHORIZE THE MAYOR TO EXECUTE AND DELIVER AN AGREEMENT FOR SAID SERVICES; TO PROVIDE FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE; AND FOR OTHER LAWFUL PURPOSES.**

**WHEREAS**, the Mayor and Council are vested with the authority to approve contracts of the City of Dublin; and

**WHEREAS**, sewer mains located at Church Street and Rice Avenue have sustained breaks and need immediate repair and upgrade; and

**WHEREAS**, the existing conditions pose an imminent danger to the public health and welfare, and/or the loss of an essential government service; and

**WHEREAS**, the existing conditions constitute an emergency which necessitate entering a contract for the repair and upgrade of the sewer mains without conducting the public works bidding process pursuant to O.C.G.A. § 36-91-22(e); and

**WHEREAS**, the Mayor and Council wish to empower the City Manager to approve expenditures for the project up to a set amount without the need for further action from the Mayor and Council.

**THEREFORE, NOW BE IT RESOLVED BY THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF DUBLIN** that an emergency exists which necessitates the immediate repair of the sewer lines on N. Church Street and Rice Avenue and that the City Manager is authorized to negotiate a contract for the emergency repair and upgrade of the sewer mains located at Church Street and Rice Avenue and that upon his approval the Mayor is authorized to execute and deliver the same on behalf of the city without further authorization from Council.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that the minutes of the meeting where this Resolution is approved shall document the nature of the emergency and the need for action which is exempt from the public works bidding process as outlined in the “WHEREAS” clauses above, which are incorporated herein and so resolved.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that this Resolution shall have immediate effect upon adoption.

SO RESOLVED by the Mayor and Council of the City of Dublin this 1<sup>st</sup> day of February, 2024 by a vote of 4 to 0.
